

Get Safe Online Training Event - Tuesday 19 March 2019.

Police Scotland SCD (Specialist Crime Division) Safer Communities continues to seek opportunities to support staff in relation to Cybercrime Prevention, providing awareness sessions/resources intended to increase understanding and skills in this ever evolving area. To aid this continued development, Safer Communities have organised CPD training sessions during March in collaboration with Get Safe Online and supported by the Royal Bank of Scotland (RBS).
