The PHF's mission is to "help people overcome disadvantage and lack of opportunity, so that they can realise their potential and enjoy fulfilling and creative lives". The Foundation places particular focus on supporting both young people and the arts. The Foundation's strategy (launched in June 2015) identifies six priorities relating to changes it wishes to see in the UK. These are:

- To support imaginative people to nurture exciting ideas.
- To widen access and participation in the arts.
- To improve people's education and learning through the arts.
- To show that the arts make a difference to people's lives.
- To support the development and growth of organisations investing in young people and positive change.
- To improve support for young people who migrate, and strengthen integration so that communities can live well together.

Objectives of Fund

The Shared Ground Fund provides financial support to non-profit organisations in the UK for projects that contribute to one of the following aims:

- **Staying safe** – ensuring that young people who have migrated can address the significant barriers that affect their ability to thrive.
- **Living well together** – supporting work that helps communities experiencing high levels of migration become stronger and more connected.
