Introduction to Moving Forward Together



What is Moving Forward Together

- Moving Forward Together is a **Vision** to transform **healthcare** and **social care** services
- It describes **new ways of working** that provide safe, effective, person centred care to:
 - **Deliver improvements in care and outcomes for all patients service users and carers by:**
 - Maximising available resources
 - Making best use of innovation and technology
- The **Blueprint** for change was approved by NHSGGC Health Board and has been noted by the six Integration Joint Boards
- Sets a **strategic direction** of travel for the next **3 to 5 years** and beyond to meet future needs of the **whole population**
- It is aligned with **Scottish Government** strategy and plans



What MFT aims to deliver

MFT aspires to transform health and social care to deliver an integrated and seamless **tiered system of care** that:

- Puts the Person at the Centre
- Supports people to live longer healthier lives at home or in a homely setting
- Provides more care in or close to people's homes in their community
- Provides more specialist care in a community setting
- Provides world-class specialist hospital care for our whole population



Why we need to transform services

Demographic changes means our **current models** of care are facing a number of challenges



The current **'fix and treat' approach** to healthcare doesn't focus on prevention, self-management and reablement



Increasing reliance on hospital care is simply not in the best interests of people



The **increasing demand** will simply **not be met** unless we change how services are accessed and used



There is a **limited** budget to spend on health and social care, and we need to use our resources to provide services that are **realistic, affordable and sustainable**

Agreed Programme Priorities

To meet challenges we aim to deliver **Tiered models of care** working across the **whole system** to:



1. Maximise Primary, Community and Virtual Care Opportunities
2. Align with West of Scotland Regional Plans
3. Optimise our Hospital Based Services



Local tiers are provided across the whole of GGC at / close to people's homes to promote independence and self management




Working with our staff , our people and wider stakeholders on initial concepts to develop more detailed plans



Implementing the Vision

Agreed programme structure: 6 Workstreams & Governance



Implementation Progress Summary

Programme has had five main areas of focus:

1. **Establish the Programme Executive Group**
 - Bring together cross-system senior leaders as Executive Group
 - Identify 3 initial key change priorities for each Workstream
2. **Establish management groups to drive the 6 Workstreams**
 - Identify 3 initial key change priorities for each Workstream
 - Programme Board agreed priorities to for delivery
 - Each workstream to develop the initial case for change for each priority
 - Work alongside stakeholders to develop more detailed proposals
3. **Establish a Programme Stakeholder Reference Group**
 - Patients, Service Users and Carers to sense check concepts and assist with wider public engagement
4. **Establish a Programme Management Office Team**
 - Programme Executive Lead, Medical Lead, 2 Programme Management Officers, Public Involvement Lead & Admin Officer



Implementation Progress Summary

5. Ongoing development and delivery of the Strategic Involvement and Communications Plan
 - Raise awareness of the Programme and the emerging workstream priorities and have initial conversations with people, staff and stakeholder
 - Deliver a series public engagement sessions
 - Understand what ‘matters most to people’
 - Presented in partnership with HSCP colleagues as part of ‘What Next for Renfrewshire’ Strategic Plan event 18 Jan 2019
 - Staff engagement sessions
 - To develop the links and hear how we might turn concepts into reality
