

Volunteer Impact Measurement

The Scottish Volunteering Forum (SVF) recently invited a range of volunteer-involving organisations from across Scotland to participate in a Volunteering Impact Measurement questionnaire. The results have been really interesting and have given the Forum lots of food for thought. It's a good piece of work and it would be great if you could share the results with organisations within your own network.

SVF presented the findings of this report at the Cross-Party Group (CPG) on Volunteering on 7th June and hope that this will raise the profile of the importance of measuring impact of volunteering. It's timely as the Scottish Government develops the Volunteering National Framework and SVF will be tying this work in to the development of the Framework.
