Ivano will speak about early intervention and social connectedness within Esteem.

He graduated in 1993 from Glasgow Caledonian University with a BA in Health Studies and a Community Psychiatric Nurse (CPN) Diploma. He has worked in Esteem for almost 13 years as a Team Leader and has undertaken additional studies to support the demands of his post and enhance professional interests. His specific interests are psycho-social interventions for people who experience psychosis and their families, family work, animal assisted therapy, the use of sport as a therapeutic agent, risk management and effective multi disciplinary and multi agency working.
